- 4. If we don't take action to establish standards who will?


WHAT ARE THE NHSBCA GOALS FOR THE TAKE BACK THE GAME INITIATIVE

- Our intended result is to elevate the standing of scholastic basketball coaches and to reinforce the value of playing scholastic sports.

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WHAT DO WE STAND FOR?

1. Stop monetizing youth sports, prioritize people over profits.

2. Educating parents, players, coaches and other interested parties about what the youth/grass roots landscape is and the role educational-based athletics plays in it.

3. Providing truthful accurate data regarding chance of playing college basketball, getting a scholarship, and/or playing professional basketball.

4. Providing-data of realistic financial costs for a player to participate in grassroots basketball, and additional costs to be labeled an "elite" player.

5. Requiring all grassroots/youth basketball coaches to be First Aid, CPR certified and to have a background check.

 Requiring all grassroots/youth basketball coaches to have some education/training regarding proper ways to teach and coach players, and what behavior is expected by coaches.
Create a positive learning and playing environment for individuals and teams,

8. Affirm the importance of adolescents having the opportunity to participate in multiple sports.

9. Stress the teaching and expectations of all, in regard to good sportsmanship.

10. Promote the value of School-based basketball (and all athletics) in teaching life lessons and team building.

WHAT ARE WE OPPOSED TO?

- 1. Abuse of any kind (physical, verbal, emotional and mental)
- 2. Long trips by travel teams before 12 years old.
- 3. Against travel every weekend
- 4. Not teaching the fundamentals of the game of basketball
- 5. "Requiring" focus on a single sport.

INTERESTING FACTS

- Less than 3% of all high school athletes player their sport in college
- One 1 in 10,000 high school athletes get even a partial college athletic scholarship
- Youth sports is a 28 BILLION dollar industry
- 1.3 percent of high school athletes will get a full scholarship
