He now resides in Fishers, Indiana with his wife of 24 years, Sonja, and their twelve-year-old daughter Anna. Currently, he serves as the Head Boys Basketball Coach at Noblesville High School, leaving a profound impact on his players and the basketball community.

McClelland began his coaching journey in 1995 at Yorktown High School, which laid the foundation for an illustrious career. Over time, he transitioned from girls to boys' basketball, showing versatility and adaptability. His coaching stints include roles at Wapahani , Blue River Valley, Cathedral, Scecina, Morristown, Brebeuf, Western Boone and back to Morristown with each move punctuated by increased team success and player advancement to college level basketball. His leadership has resulted in multiple championship wins, including the transformative state championship in 2018 with Morristown Jr. Sr. High School.

Since 2021, McClelland has been driving Noblesville High School's basketball program to new heights. He led the team to win the 2023 Sectional 8 Championship, the first in 13 years. With back-to-back winning seasons and the most wins in a season since the 2009-2010 season, he has truly revitalized the program. McClelland's resilient coaching philosophy, combined with his commitment to player development, serves as a prime example for coaches across all sports, reminding us of the transformative power of determination, mentorship, and genuine passion for the game.
